Leathers cat. 90 and 95 – Leathers cat. 90 and 95 – cowhide cowhide cowhide A broad spectrum of leather and cowhide types is utilized in manufacturing our furniture. They come from different animals, are of diverse grades, and have undergone different tanning, dyeing and finishing processes.

Care: It is advisable to dust the furniture Care: frequently since otherwise the material's pores will get clogged, hindering the natural air circulation. Use only a soft, dry cloth; do not use brushes which might irreparably damage the surface. Keep leather and cowhide away from heat since it can dry out these materials, making them fragile. To condition these products and prevent them from drying out, we recommend treating the surface with saddle soap (found in many shops) about every six months. Removing spots from leather or cowhide is a very tricky task; eliminating some kinds (grease, ink and alcohol) is impossible. If they are tackled immediately, other sorts of spots can be removed by using soapy water or another appropriate cleanser. Be sure to rinse and dry the piece immediately, using a soft cloth. Never utilize acetone, alcohol, carbon tetrachloride, detergents or abrasives to remove stains: they would cause irreparable damage to the surface and colour of these materials.
