# Finishes Care & Maintenance

With regular care and maintenance, your naughtone furniture will provide years of satisfaction. To maintain the finish quality of your naughtone products, please follow the cleaning procedures provided below.

# **Powder Coated Metal**

#### **Normal Cleaning**

Wash coated metal surfaces with a soft cloth soaked in detergent and warm water; rinse thoroughly and dry.

Remove scuff marks from low-gloss coatings with pre-softened paste wax, following the instructions on the label.

Remove scuff marks and scratches from high-gloss coatings using automotive polishing compounds, either liquid or paste.

After polishing, apply a pre-softened automotive paste wax to restore original sheen.

Do not use abrasive, acid, alcohol-based, or solvent-based cleaners; they may damage the paint finish.

# **Polished Aluminium (uncoated)**

#### **Normal Cleaning**

Apply a pre-softened paste wax to polished aluminum components following the instructions on the label.

In humid atmospheres near salt water, apply the wax once a month.

In other areas, apply wax every three months to maintain the appearance of the aluminum.

# **Polished Chrome**

#### **Normal Cleaning**

Wet cheesecloth in a nonabrasive cleaner, like liquid dish soap, and rub the chrome component lightly until the original luster reappears.

Dry the component with a clean soft cloth to remove any soap residue.

#### Glass

#### **Normal Cleaning**

Use products specifically designed for glass.

# Polypropylene

#### **Normal Cleaning**

Wash plastic surfaces with a soft cloth soaked in mild detergent and warm water.

Rinse thoroughly and dry with a clean soft cloth. Do not use solvents or abrasive kitchen cleaners.

Usual alcohol-based disinfectants can be used.

## Wood & Veneer

#### **Normal Cleaning**

Dust furniture with a slightly damp soft lint-free cloth. Wipe dry with a dry soft cloth in the direction of the wood grain.

#### Once a Month

Clean the surface with a soft cloth dampened with a quality cleaner formulated for wood furniture.

Wipe the surface in the direction of the wood grain to remove dirt and fingerprints. Wipe dry with a clean dry cloth.

#### **Twice a Year**

Apply a good quality furniture polish with a clean soft cloth.

Do not use aerosol-powered cleaners or polishes. Also, do not use polishes containing waxes or abrasives, or polishes that are oil based.

#### Minor Repair of Water Rings, Stains, and Scratches

Rub the surface lightly in the direction of the wood grain using No. 0000 steel wool.

Apply a scratch-removing polish with a color and value that simulates the veneer.

If the scratches are deep, consult a professional furniture refinisher.

# Marble

## Normal Cleaning

Wash with a soft cloth and a mixture of a mild detergent and warm water. Rinse with warm water and wipe dry with a clean soft cloth.

Rinse the tabletop with warm water to remove surface dirt and wipe dry with a clean soft cloth for routine maintenance.

#### Acid-based Liquids, Such as Coffee, Wine, and Fruit Juice

Wipe up immediately using a clean soft cloth. The longer a spillremains, the more difficult it will be to remove and may stain.

Do not use abrasive, acid, alcohol-based, or solvent-based cleaners, they will damage the surface.

# **Upholstery Care & Maintenance**

# **Regular Cleaning for Upholstery**

Weekly light vacuuming is desirable to remove dirt and dust particles and greatly extends the life of the fabric.

Under conditions of normal wear, annual or semiannual cleaning will preserve and enhance wool or woolblend upholstery.

Housekeeping schedules, however, should be site-specific and correctly adapted to the nature and degree of usage experienced. Seating in the vicinity of food counters or bars, for example, is obviously more prone to abuse and should therefore be subject to more frequent attention.

Call in professional cleaning services or use only reputable brands of upholstery shampoo and follow the maker's instructions exactly, first testing the product on an inconspicuous part of the furniture.

Never use soap, ammonia, bleach or other cleaners intended for use on hard surfaces.

# **Removing Stains**

If something should be spilt or dropped on wool wool blend furnishing fabric, the golden rule for removing stains is speed.

Most spots will vanish if treated immediately and are not allowed to dry in, so keep the necessary cleaning materials all together in one convenient place.

First, mop up any excess liquid with absorbent tissue or a clean cloth and scoop up dry solids on a spoon.

Most stains can be treated with one of three cleaning liquids – dry cleaning fluid, upholstery shampoo or clean water.

Use the cleaning method shown in the chart.

Always work inwards from the edge of the stain to prevent spreading.

Do not over-wet the fabric but use small amounts of cleaning liquid at a time and blot between applications.

Liquids should never be pressed through the fabric.

Continue until the stain has disappeared.

Do not rush or panic, but work patiently and thoroughly. If the stain cannot be identified or removed, seek expert advice from a reputable dry cleaning organisation.

#### **Caution!**

Dry cleaning fluids may be toxic or flammable.
